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ABOUT THE SCHOOL

HISTORY

The Doon School was founded in 1935 by Mr. S.R. Das, a barrister in Manchester, United Kingdom. Situated at the foothills of the Himalayas, north of Delhi, in a campus of Sixty-nine acres, the School is home to approximately 595 students.



THE SCHOOL'S MISSION

"To attract and develop exceptional students and teachers from all backgrounds to serve a meritocratic India; inspire them to be just and ethical citizens; train them to be wise and principled leaders; and prepare them to enter one of the strongest fraternities – for life."

ADMISSIONS POLICY

The School offers admission to students from every state in India and to students of Indian origin from across the globe. It offers a six-year course, the entry level being Class 7 and in some cases Class 8 also. The admission process includes a written examination as well as a group discussion.

FINANCIAL AID

The School offers a means-tested bursary, and our admissions are both need-based as well as need-blind. Also, merit-based scholarships are awarded for Academic Excellence.

LEARNING CENTRE

The Doon School has a robust Learning Center dedicated to assisting students in reaching their full academic potential through both support and enrichment programs. Students are referred to the center following assessments conducted by professionals.

AWARDS AND HONOURS

Students are awarded various awards for their contribution and excellence in academic, sporting and co-curricular areas of School. The most coveted ones are:

- Scholar's Blazer: This is awarded to students who are 'scholarly' and have maintained highest academic standing in School. They also have to have been a part of a robust reading programme.
- Game's Blazer: This is awarded to students who have consistently played for school and have achieved success for the team over a period of four years in one or more sport.
- School Colours: These are awarded to students of grade 11 and 12 who have shown integrity and responsibility in their School careers and particularly in activities that improved the life of the community.
- Reading Awards: These awards encourage students to read and improve their reading skills. These awards give recognition to those who read in several categories: Senior, Medium and Junior, each having Bronze, Silver and Gold levels. Colours in Arts, Debating (English and Hindi) Dramatics and Quizzing are awarded to students for their exemplary contribution to these areas in their school life.

THE DOON SCHOOL CURRICULUM

The Doon School Curriculum (DSC) is rooted in the history of the School, focusing on the holistic development of the students. The School's value system is based upon students being upright citizens of the world and in preparing them for roles of leadership and service in society.

The Doon School operates a seven-day-week traditional timetable with only morning classes on Saturdays.

The School is affiliated to the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), (IGCSE) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

CISCE is one of the two national boards available in India. The Council conducts public examinations in March every year, at the end of Class X and XII for which it awards the Indian School Certificate.

At The Doon School, students have the option of choosing either the ISC or IB Diploma programme, after Class X.

Socially useful and productive work (SUPW) is an integral part of the curriculum at The Doon School. All students from grade 7 to grade 12 need to complete a minimum of 20 hours per term to be awarded a pass degree

CLASS RANKS AND GPA

The Doon School does not award class ranks and GPA. The competitive nature of entry to The Doon School and the variety of academic backgrounds of its boys as well as the sheer breadth of opportunity within the curriculum, attempting to put a numerical rank that reflects the strengths and weaknesses of students would not yield a true or useful picture of the accomplishments of final SC form (Class 12).






• International General Certificate of Secondary Certificate (IGCSE):




• International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP):




• Indian Certificate of Secondary Education Examination Summary (ICSE):

MID-TERMS

Each term students and Masters head off for five days into the mountains. The Class XI and XII boys plan and undertake the trips on their own, which requires considerable leadership and organizational skills. Such an activity is still unheard of in many countries around the world and class VII-X go on escorted treks with their tutors.

THE DOON SCHOOL CO-CURRICULUM

The co-curricular life forms a critical part of the School's educational philosophy. Students spend three hours a day/post lunch in supervised activities. These activities include engagement in the fields of art, music and sports. 15 sports are played at the team and individual levels. The performing and creative arts enrich the education of each student on campus. 50 clubs and societies provide opportunities to students to pursue their interests and enhance their intellectual curiosity and skills of innovation. There are over 15 annual publications featuring all aspects of school life in addition to a weekly newspaper which students have produced every week for 89 years. The philosophy of the DSC is transitioned into the lives of the boys through the following core activities as well.

SERVICE & SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Social service has been an integral part of The Doon School since its inception. Mr. Arthur Foot, the first Headmaster, believed that "the students should leave Doon School as members of an aristocracy, but it must be an aristocracy of service inspired by ideas of unselfishness, not one of privilege, wealth or position." Every student is involved in a wide variety of projects near and far as well as internationally through the Round Square Association. Building schools, teaching and providing medical aid are some of the works being done by our students in urban slum areas and villages.
